

14th Annual Sujata Jayawardena Memorial Oration

'Sabka Sath Sabka Vikas : Together We Progress' India Sri Lanka Relations in the light of India's Neighbourhood First Policy.

High Commissioner H.E. Taranjit Singh Sandhu High Commissioner of India to Sri Lanka delivered the 14th Annual Sujata Jayawardena Memorial Oration in April 2018 at the BMICH on the topic 'Sabka Sath Sabka Vikas: Together We Progress' India Sri Lanka Relations in the light of India's Neighbourhood First Policy.

The High Commissioner was escorted by a Ceremonial Procession to the Hall and joined the Vice Chancellor Senior Professor Lakshman Dissanayake, President Alumni Association Mr. Rajeev Amarasuriya and Senior Professor Nayani Melagoda at the head table.

The inaugural address was delivered by Mr. Rajeev Amarasuriya, President Alumni Association, which was followed by an address by the Vice Chancellor Senior Professor Lakshman Dissanayake. Senior Professor Nayani Melagoda then introduced the Orator,

who delivered a very pertinent and interesting Oration on the said topic.

High Commissioner Sandhu in his address emphasised that 'Sabka Sath Sabka Vikas: Together We Progress' sums up in one line the very essence of India's Neighbourhood First policy. He reiterated the importance India attaches to progressing together with Sri Lanka, as self-interest alone is neither in Indian culture nor in Indian behaviour. He added that neighbourhood is crucial not just because of the close proximity, neighbourhood is significant because the two nations are joined as one larger people.

He spoke about the three 'B's which signify India-Sri Lanka relations: Broad, Blend and Buddha. He emphasised that India has never believed in setting conditions for friendship. He said India's heart is broad and big; India does not see friendships through a transactional lens. He added that India has always believed in sharing what it has; even while struggling to meet its own developmental priorities, India has shared the fruits of its expertise, knowledge and skill set with its friends and partners.

He noted that Buddhism first came to Sri Lanka from India before it spread anywhere in the world. This was not just because of proximity, it was because of the interconnectedness India and Sri Lanka felt for each other, even in those times. He added that King Ashoka sent his own worthy children Mahinda and Sangamitta to Sri Lanka to spread Buddhism, while sending emissaries to other parts of the globe. Sri Lanka was special for India not just now, but even then. He noted that India is proud of its Buddhist identity.

High Commissioner Sandhu noted how leaders in both countries have imparted a new energy to India-Sri Lanka ties.

High Commissioner Sandhu noted that India believes that success of one must propel the growth of many. He specified that the real ownership of India-Sri Lanka relations rests with the people in both nations. The people have to decide whether to look at the past, survive in the present or work towards a common future. He reassured that India will be there for Sri Lanka whenever Sri Lanka needs India.

Mr. Rajeev Amarasuriya then presented the High Commissioner with the Sujata Jayawardena Memorial Plaque for having delivered the 14th Oration. The Vote of Thanks was by Deshamanya Tissa Devendra. The Master of Ceremonies was Dr. Naazima Kamardeen. The proceedings were followed by fellowship and refreshments.

They were former Director of the Medical Research Institute, founder Professor of Medical Microbiology at the University of Sri Jayewardenepura and former Cabinet Minister Vidya Jyothi Tissa Vitarana, Educationist, Promoter of Women's Rights and Emeritus Professor of Education, University of Colombo Deshabandu Kala Keerthi Professor Swarna Jayaweera, Co-Founder of the Marga Institute Deshamanya Dr. Godfrey

Gunatilleke, Former Chairman and Managing Director of Aitken Spence and Company for almost twenty years, Founder Chairman of LOLC and several other organizations Deshamanya Charitha Prasanna De Silva, Former Archaeological Commissioner and author of several publications including 'Sigiriya and its Significance' and 'Distortions in History' Vidya Jyothi Dr. Rajendra Hemapala De Silva, founding Dean of the Faculty of Engineering and Architecture, University of Moratuwa, the first Professor of Electronic Engineering in Sri Lanka's University system and the Chancellor of the University of Moratuwa Vidya Jyothi Professor K. Programme with Nations Trust Bank and Bridge Partnership



Nations Trust Bank together with the Alumni Association of the University of Colombo and the "Bridge Partnership", a reputed international training firm, initiated a socio-emotional skills workshop for the undergraduates of the University. The programme commenced in the year 2017 and will be conducted till 2020.

A significant component of the programme was that it was equipped with a mentoring component, where senior management of the bank volunteered to guide undergraduates over a transitional period of 3 months to assist them to adjust from their university life till the beginning of their careers.

Six workshops were conducted from July 2017 to February 2019, with over 150 students of University of Colombo taking part in

the programme. 28 members of the Senior Management from the bank volunteered as mentors for these programmes adding up to 141 hours of employee volunteering. With the objective of improving emotional intelligence, interpersonal communication and personal resilience of undergraduates, many further workshops are scheduled to be held before the 30th of June 2020.


In recognition of the progress of this successful initiative, the Department of Economics hosted a ceremonial inauguration and felicitation recently at the Auditorium of the Department of Economics.

English Language Skills Development Programme with Deutsche Bank Sri Lanka

As an integral component of the University Corporate Partner Programme the Alumni Association of the University of Colombo partnered with Deutsche Bank Sri Lanka to conduct a Business English Programme for the resident undergraduates at the Sujata Jayawardena Hostel located down Buller's Lane, Colombo 7. The programme was fully sponsored by Deutsche Bank Sri Lanka, and part of the University Corporate Partnership Programme.

The programme focused on effective communication, a key factor for success and in today's context, it is essential for undergraduates and graduates seeking employment. Organizations look for potential employees who can use the English Language effectively in day to day work situations; such as meetings, discussions, individual performance, specifically in every core area of business in an organization. In this context, many undergraduates and graduates face tremendous

competition when trying to secure an employment opportunity and then performing to an optimum level. However, effective training in English Language used in a business context can elevate these individuals to be confident in facing interviews, meeting people and addressing large audiences.

The course was conducted by Sphere Academy & Management Consultants Pvt. Ltd. They ensured that the selected group of students were given the required requisites to be successful in gaining access to employment through effective communication.

The programme commenced in October 2017 and was conducted over 9 months (60 hours) for a group of 50 undergraduates at the Hostel. It was completed in July 2019.
